DAILY - ACTS Prayer Guide

Adoration | worship God for who He is.

Confession | agree with God about your sin.

Thanksgiving | thank God for His many blessings.

Supplication | pray for your “2010 Expectant Prayer” and for the daily intercession below.

MONDAY Our Family & Friends

In Acts 16.31 the word for household refers to our circle of influence. Begin to pray that God would move in the lives of your family and friends. Intercession is about our call to pray for others and that begins with those closest to us.

TUESDAY Our Church

Pray for our CrossPointe congregations (Orlando, Winter Park & Waterford Lakes), pastors and leaders. Pray that Christ will build His church (Matthew 16.18).

WEDNESDAY The City

The prophet Jeremiah tells us that we should, "Seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare" (Jeremiah 29.7). In other words, we will be blessed by praying for the blessing of our community or city. Don't give up on our city, but pray for a Gospel Awakening.

THURSDAY Our Nation

Habakkuk was a man who had a great burden to bring revival and restoration to Israel. He prayed, "O Lord, I have heard the report of you, and your work, O Lord, do I fear. In the midst of the years revive it; in the midst of the years make it known; in wrath remember mercy." (Habakkuk 3.2)

FRIDAY Our World

Pray that the Gospel will go to the ends of the earth (Matthew 28.19). Although you may never leave your country, you can still have an influence in the lives of others across the world by praying for them. Pray for Restore Brazil and for Haiti.

SATURDAY For Salvations

For 3 people who are outside the faith.

SUNDAY For God's Glory

In Matthew 6.9-15, Jesus instructs us to pray by beginning with, "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name." Pray that God would be glorified in our lives and church.
